

the charge because of his belief that the land upon which the soy beans were growing was "illegally" sold to the current owner by the United State's Bankruptcy Court.

6. That the issue of whether the United State's Bankruptcy Court had the authority to sell the land in question is irrelevant and immaterial to any of the issues before the court in this case.

WHEREFORE, the People of the State of Illinois pray that this court grant this motion and enter an order preventing the Defendant from offering evidence in any form and from making any comments in the presence of the jury regarding his belief that the land upon which the soy beans were growing was obtained by the land owner improperly.
